## Advanced Notification of Treatment is required

- 1. The Department has received and reviewed your application to harvest aquatic plants in McDIII Pond.
- 2. Your permit application meets the minimum requirements by law and a permit is being issued with the following conditions:
- 3. The permit holder shall report any unusual circumstances resulting from the harvesting program and annual tallies of aquatic plant material removed.
- 4. All harvesting shall not disturb the bottom sediments of the lake. The mechanism of removal cannot excavate bed material.
- 5. Harvested individual riparian owner areas AND all channels shall not exceed 30 feet in width.
- 6. Harvesting is restricted to the permitted area as described on the map of the permit. GPS guidance is required.
- 7. This office must be contacted five business days before harvesting begins for the season.
- 8. This office must be contacted two business days before harvesting in areas to remove floating algae (aka skimming areas) begins. Approval is needed for each operation.
- 9. Disposal of harvested plants shall be in upland areas as described on the permit application. No wetlands shall be filled; deposition along shoreline is not permitted. ALL FRAGMENTS must be removed from the water where practicable.
- 10. Any alteration from the plan must be approved by the Department before work begins.
- 11. This permit expires on October 1, 2022 provided no significant changes to the plan. To extend this permit for five years, an update to the current plan is needed.
- 12. No harvesting permitted in chemically treated areas within 24-hours of treatment.
